Staff Parking Lot - Staff Member Parking Only

We ask parents for your co-operation to please not park in the staff parking lot before school nor after school. In addition, the staff lot is not to be used for dropping off or picking up students. Children are continually in this area before, after and during school hours and driving in the back parking lot area presents a significant risk to the children's safety. Please do not walk through this area on your way to or from school. Please use the sidewalk where you will be safe. Staff enter and leave the parking lot at all hours of the day, so this area needs to be clear of pedestrians at all times.

School Bus Zones Student Safety

Parking in school bus zones is illegal and presents a serious safety hazard. Such parking forces a bus to double park when loading or unloading students. Parking in school bus zones creates a highly unsafe situation for students. Unauthorized vehicles will be ticketed.



Crosswalks



Always use crosswalks and pedestrian-activated signals when they're available. It's safer to cross at marked crosswalks or controlled intersections whenever possible. Pedestrians have the right of way in a crosswalk unless a peace officer or traffic control device directs otherwise. This means that even if the crosswalk is unmarked, vehicles must stop and yield to pedestrians. A pedestrian crossing a roadway outside a crosswalk must yield the right of way to vehicles.



School Fees - online payments

School Fees can be paid online via your parent portal. School fees can be paid starting **September 15**. Buss Fees can be paid immediately.

We encourage all parents to pay their fees online by accessing the PowerSchool parent portal. PowerSchool is the Edmonton Catholic Schools online program that allows parents to view attendance, assessments and pay school fees, and bus pass fees.


