Council/Society Positions

French Education Representative (VACANT): Promotes a vibrant French Immersion environment within the school. Attends School Council meetings and provides updates from the Canadian Parents for French. Raises awareness of supports for parents of French Immersion students.

APPLE Schools Representative (VACANT): Plans and executes 2 APPLE Family nights throughout the year. Keeps up to date with APPLE Schools website. Serves as resource/contact for parents with questions about the APPLE Schools program. Liaises with representatives from APPLE Schools as needed.

Catholic Education Representative (Dawn Megic): Promotes catholic education within the school (Joy Bags, Rosary Circle). Attends School Council meetings and communicates news and updates from St. John's the Evangelist Church. Leads Shrove Tuesday Pancake Breakfast.

ASCA Representative (Rosemarie Jordan): Attends School Council meetings and provides updates from the Alberta School Councils' Association. Reviews ASCA website and stays on top of workshops, news, guidelines, etc. to report back to School Council.

Fundraising Coordinator (VACANT): Attends Society meetings and liaises with various fundraising groups (Cobbs, Lunch Lady, Hot Dog Day Committee). Plans and executes 2-3 fundraisers a year, which includes promoting fundraisers, collecting orders, and coordinating volunteers for delivery, depending on the fundraiser.

Chair/President (Elected Position): Chairs all meetings and coordinates with Principal to establish meeting agendas. Communicates with the Principal on a regular basis. Decides all matters relating to rules of order at the meetings. Ensures that By-Laws are current and followed. The Chair is the official spokesperson of Council/Society and ensures there is regular communication with the whole school community; reviews any communication to the school community prior to distribution and includes the Principal in same. Stays informed about School Board policy that impacts Council/Society. Has signing authority on Society financial accounts together with the Vice-President and/or Treasurer. Complies with the School Councils Regulation by providing the school board with an annual report. Has general responsibility for all activities of the Council/Society.

Nominee: Veronica Coronado

Vice-Chair/Vice-President (Elected Position): In the event of resignation, incapacity or leave of absence of the Chair/President, the Vice-Chair will fulfill the Chair/President's responsibilities. In the absence of the Chair/President, will supervise the affairs and preside at any meetings of Council/Society. Works with and supports the Chair/President in agenda preparation. Ensures the appropriate management, in compliance with PIPA, of any personal information collected on behalf of the School Council. Promotes teamwork and assists the Chair/President in the smooth running of the meetings. Keeps informed of relevant School and School Board policies. Is prepared to assume the position of Chair/President in the future. Assists the Chair/President and undertakes tasks assigned by the Chair/President.

Nominee: Kristine Belamisca

Treasurer (Elected Position): Keeps accurate records of all financial transactions on behalf of the Society. Ensures that records are available upon request. Is responsible for the deposits of all monies paid to the Society. Has signing authority on Society financial accounts together with the President and/or Vice-President. Presents a full, detailed account of receipts and disbursements to the Society as required and prepares the financial statements for annual reports.

Nominee: Geraldine Simpson

Secretary (Elected Position): Acts as a recorder at each meeting and ensures that the minutes are prepared accurately to reflect the directions agreed to at the meeting. Keeps minutes, correspondence, records and other Council/Society documents and ensures that all relevant documents (as per legislation) are available to the public in an accessible location in the School, for a period of 7 years. Maintains a dated record of all the members of the Council/Society who have knowingly provided their contact information, in compliance with PIPA.

Nominee: Sandra Perrin

Directors at Large (3 Elected Positions): Attend and actively participate in monthly meetings of the Society Board. Actively support the initiatives and actions of the Society. Approve policies and recommendations received from the Board. Review Bylaws and recommend amendments as appropriate. Review annual budget and submit for membership approval. Assist in developing and maintaining positive working relations among the Board, committees, School and School Council to support and enhance education in the School Community.
